

CORPORATIONS LAW  
A COMPANY LIMITED BY GUARANTEE  
MEMORANDUM OF ASSOCIATION  
Of  
DAIRY GOAT SOCIETY OF AUSTRALIA LIMITED

- 1) The name of the company is Dairy Goat Society of Australia Limited ("the Society").
- 2) The main objects for which the Society is established as a company are:
  - (a) To take over the funds records and other assets, to accept the liabilities, and to perform the functions of the unincorporated association known as the Dairy Goat Society of Australia.
  - (b) To maintain the purity of and to promote and encourage the breeding of pedigreed goats of all dairy breeds.
  - (c) To promote and raise the standards of breeding, health and welfare and the keeping of all breeds of dairy goats.
  - (d) To promote the holding of exhibitions and to conduct exhibitions of dairy goats of all breeds.
  - (e) To promote and encourage the importation and exportation of all breeds of dairy goats into and out of Australia.
  - (f) To co-operate with the medical profession, hospitals, public health authorities and clinics with a view to encouraging a supply of goats milk.
  - (g) To collect, verify and publish information relating to the breeding, management and exhibiting of dairy goats.
  - (h) To make appropriate provisions for registering stock, recording and publishing production figures.
  - (i) To purchase or lease any real property.
  - (j) To accept any gift or legacy of money or property whether subject to any special trust or not.
  - (k) To invest any moneys of the Society in such manner as may from time to time be determined.
  - (l) To make contributions towards awards, medals and prizes for competitions and exhibitions and to make awards from time to time.
  - (m) To compile, print and publish at intervals a Herd Book of all breeds of dairy goats.
  - (n) To encourage the affiliation of and to affiliate with other bodies having similar objects to the Society's.
  - (o) To encourage members to become competent and qualified to judge the various breeds of dairy goats and to compile lists of qualified persons.
  - (p) To establish relations with Societies having similar objects and encourage exchanges with Societies of a like nature.
  - (q) To prescribe or approve standards in relation to sales or exhibition of dairy goats.

- (r) To regulate the conduct of members in relation to the exhibitions.
- (s) To make regulations and by-laws for the purpose of carrying out or giving affect to any of the objects of the Society.
- (t) To print and publish any newspapers, periodicals, books or leaflets that the Society may think desirable for the promotion of its objects.
- (u) To promote in any way not mentioned above the interests of members as breeders of pedigreed dairy goats.

Without being limited by the foregoing the Society has the powers set out in Section 161 of the Corporations Law.

- 3) Notwithstanding the generality of the objects of the Society as set out in clause 2 of this Memorandum the Society must not amalgamate with any company corporation society association or organisation which does not prohibit the distribution of its income and property amongst its members to an extent at least as great as that imposed on the Society under and by virtue of clause 4 of this Memorandum.
- 4) The income and property of the Society must be applied solely towards the promotion of the objects of the Society and no portion of it can be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend bonus or in any other way by way of profit to the members of the Society PROVIDED THAT nothing in this clause prevents the payment in good faith of reasonable and proper remuneration to any officer or servant of the Society or to any member of the Society in return for any services actually rendered to the Society nor prevents the payment of interest at a rate not exceeding interest at the rate for the time being charged by bankers in Sydney for overdraft accounts on money lent or reasonable and proper rent for premises demised or let by any member of the Society.
- 5) The liability of the members is limited.
- 6) Each member of the Society undertakes to contribute to the property of the Society, if it is wound up while he is a member or within one year after he ceases to be a member for the payment of the debts and liabilities of the Society contracted before he ceases to be a member and of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up and for the adjustment of the rights of the contributories among themselves, any amount required not exceeding Twenty Dollars (\$20.00).
- 7) If upon winding up or dissolution of the Society any property remains after satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities this cannot be paid or distributed among the members of the Society but must be given or transferred to some other institution or institutions having objects similar to the objects of the Society and prohibitions on the distribution of its or their income and property among its or their members to an extent at least as great as is imposed on the Society by Clause 4 of this Memorandum, the institution or institutions to be determined by the members of the Society at or before the time of dissolution, and if and so far as effect cannot be given to the previous provision the property remaining is to be applied to some charitable objects.
